

St Mary's Thorpe A House of Prayer for All Church Family News Week of 6th July

Greetings

This Sunday morning I will be talking about the vision for St.Mary's as a House of Prayer for All, with an emphasis upon 'how' we are the church, ie. how we conduct ourselves in our relationships with God, others and ourselves. At a time when St Mary's and the church more widely is struggling to be heard and to make ends meet, it's tempting to prioritise what we can do to change things and to grow the church. However, in our first Bible reading we are reminded that we 'reap whatever we sow' and I am convinced from experience and what I've learned about the grace and love of God, that if we prioritise 'how' we are as church (this is the sowing, in relationships) then we can trust God for the rest. The church of the future will probably look very different. If it's the fruit of our doing, it will fade away, but if it is the fruit of God's work through our sowing in loving, open and robust relationships, then it will be beautiful, resilient and life-changing. God will lead us and shape us if we humble ourselves before him and let Jesus be our example and lead in all relationships.

NT Reading: Galatians 6: 7-16

Gospel: Luke 10: 1-11, 16-20

After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. He said to them, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest.

Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, "Peace to this house!" And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you.

Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the labourer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; cure the sick who are there, and say to them, "The kingdom of God has come near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, "Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near." 'Whoever listens to you listens to me, and whoever rejects you rejects me, and whoever rejects me rejects the one who sent me.' The seventy returned with joy, saying, 'Lord, in your name even the demons submit to us!' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall from heaven like a flash of lightning. See, I have given you authority to tread on snakes and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy; and nothing will hurt you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice at this, spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven.'
