Next week the midweek Holy Communion moves to Thursday at 11am, when we celebrate the Ascension of our Lord back to heaven.

Do join us, and for refreshments afterwards. The Ascension often slips off people's radar (perhaps because it's always days after Easter rather than a Sunday) but it's an important day on which to celebrate Christ returning to the right hand of God our Father where he intercedes for us. From this Sunday and through Ascensiontide to Pentecost, we shall be taking a fresh look at the Lord's prayer.
